### What is Key Leader Weekend?

Key Leader by Kiwanis is a weekend leadership program for high school students. Our mission is to inspire young people to achieve their personal best through service leadership.

This program teaches skills essential for students to become values-driven leaders. Students learn to connect with students from different backgrounds and experience what it means to be a team player. They learn that working together is the key to successfully completing important projects and that real leaders put others first. This is an opportunity to make lifetime friends with people who share their integrity and values.

Since 2005 more than 33,000 students around the world have participated in Key Leader Weekends.

### What do students need to bring?

We stay in dormitory style cabins. Students have a packing list provided. They are to bring sheets and a blanket or sleeping bag, pillow, toiletries, clothes for the weekend, towel, flashlight, etc. Our camp is located at 25975 Greenwell Springs Road in Greenwell Springs, LA. This is 10 miles northeast of Baton Rouge, LA. **Meals are included in the fees.** We also provide healthy snacks between meals.

### Scholarships may be available

\* A student facilitator applies for the position and is selected by the Key Leader Committee. The student facilitator must have attended a Key Leader Weekend before or have leadership skills acquired from serving as an officer in Key Club, student government or another school organization.

\*\* This fee is to cover the cost of a background check. If a chaperone has had a recent background check through Kiwanis, there is no fee.
